



Worldwide, more than 2.2 billion people lack access to clean drinking water. However, even more people, about half the world's population, lack access to safe sanitation. In Kenya, studies have shown that women often avoid using toilets at night due to the increased sexual assault risk, and girls without access to toilets at school are more likely to miss up to 20% of the school year.

Well Aware's new Sanitation program aims to change these statistics.

For the past 14 years, Well Aware has delivered comprehensive water systems to communities across East Africa, with a primary focus on deep borehole water wells and rainwater catchment systems. Consistently, most communities who lack access to water also lack access to sanitation facilities, such as toilets, which poses significant challenges to public health, education rates, gender equality, and more. Water and sanitation go handin-hand, and Well Aware is more than ready to expand our programs to include sanitation and double our impact on rural communities in the region.





CLASSROOMS TO CIFAN WATER

In regions experiencing water scarcity, many children walk an average of 3.7 miles each day to gather water for their families, usually carrying 5-gallon jerry cans that can weigh up to 40 pounds. They often miss school to do so, and can easily fall behind and drop out.

That's why, students across the country are raising awareness about the global water crisis to help Well Aware fund clean water projects in East Africa.

Well Aware's Classrooms to Clean Water program empowers the next generation of conscious global citizens through interactive classroom activities, leadership development, and engaging team fundraising activities.

In 2023, our Classrooms to Clean Water Initiative, along with 6 schools, fundraised over \$16,000!

With access to clean water, education increases by 34% on average, and 58% for girls specifically. For every year a girl remains in school in Kenya, her future income increases by 12%.

Spicewood 5th graders participated in a Water Walk to learn more about Sustainable Development Goal #6 and experience first-hand what it's like to walk for water. The 5th graders were determined to raise as much money as they could, with their original goal being \$1,000. They ended up raising \$5,000! 333 people now have clean water because of these 5th graders and their teachers' efforts!

COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHT

Oloile, Kenya

Project Type: Deep Borehole Well

Year Completed: 2023

Population Impacted: 1,000+

Oloile Primary School sits in the southern arid region of rural Kenya, with a school population of 480 students and a surrounding community of about 1,000 members. Previously, the school and the community relied on a seasonal river for their



water. When the river would go dry, they would have no other option than to buy this scarce resource from vendors which proved hard and expensive. The water generally consumed by the Oloile community was highly contaminated, being the cause for years of constant water borne illnesses, unhygienic practices and malnutrition amongst young kids, as well as low attendance in school.

The tide of adversity has turned for the Oloile community, thanks to the implementation of a transformative water system by Well Aware. With the generous support of the Chris Long Foundation, this innovative solution has heralded a new era of prosperity and health.

This was the very first time the entire team- both the U.S. and Kenya teams— were together during implementation of a project. As a new water source was born, so was the bond between our team of 12, usually separated by thousands of miles but this time, brought together by the mission to provide clean water for more than deserving individuals. This beautiful community was so gracious in their hosting of our team and we were even gifted Maasai traditional regalia- gorgeous, intricate beaded jewelry- and the leaders crowned us as part of the Oloile community.

The once pervasive concerns about water scarcity and contamination are now relics of the past. The community of Oloile now thrives, with safe, accessible water, marking a monumental leap forward in their journey towards sustainable living and empowerment.

OLOILE PRIMARY SCHOOL, KENYA

Meet Purity, a 14 year old student from Oloile, Kenya. Her favorite subject is Arts and Crafts because it's really fun and she can be creative. She loves her school because she has great teachers that she learns a lot from. When she grows up she wants to be a journalist to share stories with people! While her mom is responsible for fetching water for their family, Purity uses their clean water to wash her hands, drink, clean her house and her uniform for school.

Dennis

OLOILE PRIMARY SCHOOL, KENYA

Meet Dennis, a 13 year old student from Oloile, Kenya. He dreams of being a football player when he grows up and loves his family, school mates and community. Before their community's new water system was installed, his school was unable to clean their classrooms were unable to wash their hands after visiting the bathroom.

Now, Dennis and his fellow classmates and their families are able to access clean and safe water without having to walk long distances.



COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHT

Kwa Kavoo, Kenya

Project Type: Rainwater Catchment + Purification

Year Completed: 2023

Population Impacted: 3,000

The implementation of a clean water system has painted a vivid landscape of transformation for Kwa Kavoo

Primary School and its surrounding community. Previously, the school struggled with inadequate and contaminated water supply from a pipeline and storage tank connected to a community borehole well. This water was only available three days a week and was unsuitable for drinking. The limited supply also made it challenging for the school to fulfill the water needs of its 233 students.

To address this issue, Well Aware designed a rainwater catchment and UV purification system specifically for the school. As a result, the students now have access to clean and safe drinking water within the school premises. Because of this reliable access to clean water, students are now able to spend more time in the classroom, enabling them to focus on their education and improve their overall health. The school's hygiene practices are also expected to improve, as the availability of abundant water will likely lead to the construction of permanent handwashing facilities.





The benefits of the clean water system extend beyond the school itself. With the new system in place, the school can now cater to the water needs of its students' families and reach a wider population of approximately 2,800 people. This increased access to clean water will have a significant impact on the community's overall well-being. It is anticipated that the project's success will attract more students to the school, resulting in increased education rates and a larger student population. The Ripple Effect of impact clean water is having on the community of Kwa Kavoo is already visible, and we are honored to be a part of this transformation.

Kanini

KWA KAVOO PRIMARY SCHOOL, KENYA

Meet Kanini, a 13 year old from Kwa Kavoo, who dreams of becoming a police officer when she grows up. Her favorite part about her community are the people who live there.

She and her siblings used to walk very long distances to fetch water that was dirty, so Kanini knows the value of clean water and how it can keep her and those she cares about safe and healthy.

Peter

KWA KAVOO PRIMARY SCHOOL, KENYA

Meet Peter, a 12 year old boy attending Kwa Kavoo Primary School. His favorite subject in school is physical education and health because when they're out in the field he feels very strong. When he grows up he wants to be a pilot, and he loves that he's able to get an education. Previously, Peter and his classmates were walking 10km a day to fetch water, which unfortunately took time away from their school day.

Now, however, Peter is able to attend school without having to worry about fetching water for himself and his family.





Meshark

KWA KAVOO PRIMARY SCHOOL, KENYA

Meet Meshark, an 11 year old student at the Kwa Kavoo Primary School. She loves school and her teachers, and said her school has a "great learning environment." When she grows up, she wants to be a judge because it is good work that helps people. She used to gather water from the river, which was 10km away from school.

Since gaining access to clean water, she says she feels good because now "there is enough safe water."






